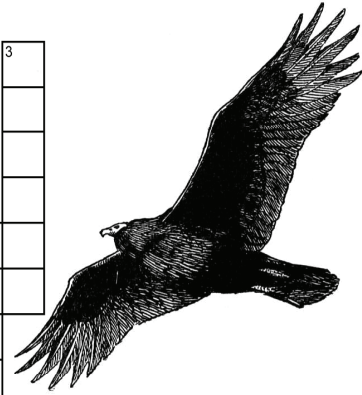
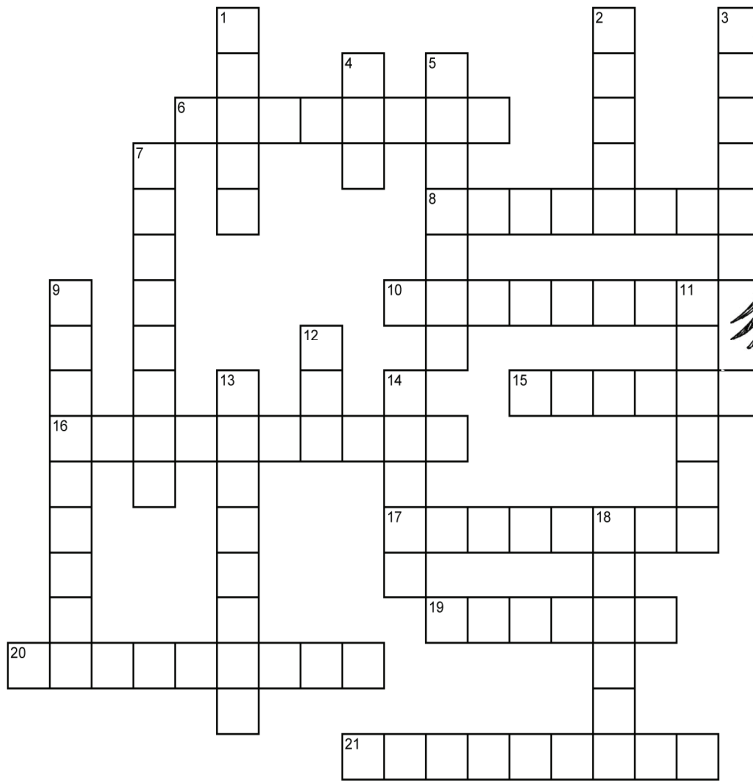

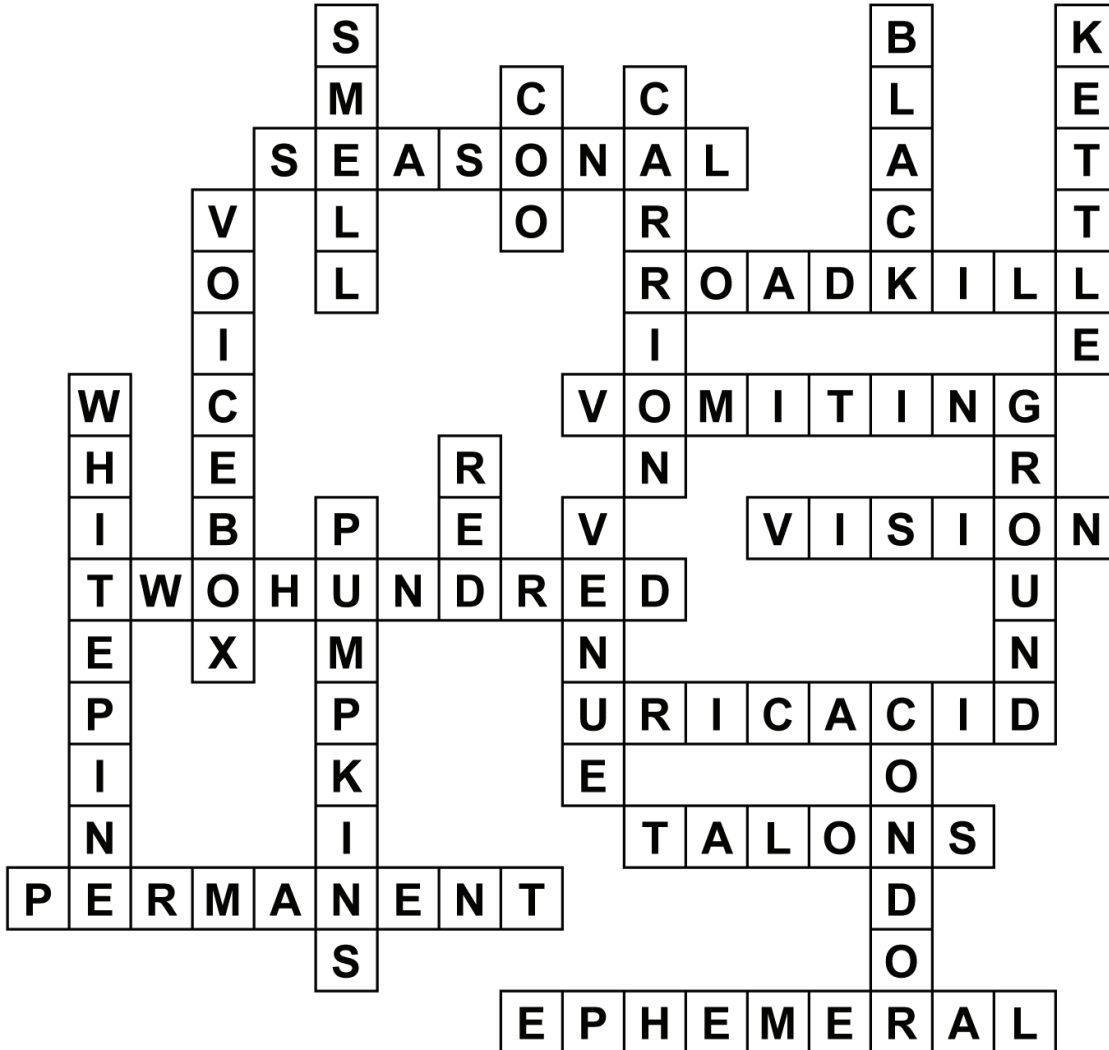
- 6 This type of roost is used from March through October
